PRO-LIFE LITERARY CONTEST

RULES:

- Contest is open to all students, grades 4 12.
- Only one entry per student, there is no limit to the number of entries per school. Teachers, please submit your entries altogether where possible!
- Your students may choose from any pro-life subject such as Abortion, Adoption,
 Disabilities, Hospice Care, Infanticide, Medical Aid in Dying, Stem Cell Research, or the
 Beauty or Value of Human Life.
- Entries can be poems, essays, fiction or non-fiction stories. This year's theme is: Proud to Be Pro-Life

(High School <u>Essays</u> that wish to also enter the National Right to Life contest in December should address the question: Why Are You Pro-Life?)

- Maximum length is limited to 1,000 words.
- Each student's name, age and school name must be included on the back of each page of their entry.
- All entries must have the provided parental permission slip submitted with them.
- Entries can be typed, computer printed, handwritten or scribed by an adult.
- All age-appropriate styles of writing are welcome. No entries considered artificial intelligence generated, abusive, insulting, offensive, or threatening will be judged.
- Entries must be the entrant's own original work.
- Copyright remains with the author, but entry remains the property of RARTL.
- All decisions by judges are final.
- Entries accepted October 1, 2025 until postmarked December 20, 2025.
